


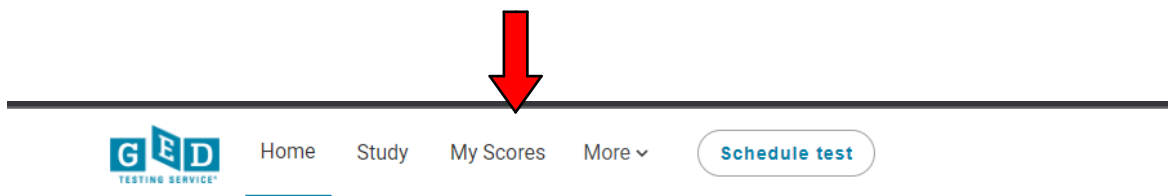
How to Review Your Test Score Report

Step 1: Log into the GED.com profile at <https://app.ged.com/login>


